But how many of us know that Steve Jobs was asked to leave the company he created and that Apple was, in all likelihood, one week away from shutting down? Founding the United Nations

An organization created in the name of peace, turned into a reason for war. While the Russo-Ukrainian war is being fought between two countries, its root cause is hidden in the west. In other words, the reason for this war is NATO membership.

The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) is an alliance between North America and Europe. It was formed after WW2 with the goal to protect democratic freedom. Due to the ongoing Cold War, it was basically an anti-Soviet agreement to counter any future aggression on the Soviet Union's part. It promised collective security to all its members.

The USSR saw NATO as a threat and to counter it, founded the Warsaw Pact in 1955. The Warsaw Pact had the same goals and aims as NATO. It promised collective security to all its members. The Warsaw Pact was dismembered in 1990 due to an agreement between the USA and Russia following the downfall of the Soviet Union. The agreement stated that if Germany joined NATO, NATO would stop expanding. While Moscow held its end of the bargain, NATO denied its claims and continued its operations, inching closer to Russian Borders. Russia saw this as a provocation as it absorbed Moscow's entire security belt. Hence, to protect itself, Russia attacked Ukraine to stop it from joining NATO.
